“Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.” - Matthew 28:19&20

Many of us know about the C.A.R.E. Ministry and how it can help Christians understand the Great Commission and use their spiritual gifts to C.A.R.E. Mark Hunicutt developed and began sharing the C.A.R.E. Ministry with other churches after God had placed us together at Fruitland Bible Institute and North Greenville University.

Mark came to our church family in 2000 to do a youth revival. During a time of conversation, I learned that Mud Creek Baptist in Hendersonville was starting a new ministry called CARE. At the time, they were not using an acrostic for the word. Our church family was (and still is) teaching the principles of the Great Commission and saw CARE as a wonderful way to tie every ministry in our church to the reality of carrying out the Great Commission. The result was that I asked Mark if we not only could use the ministry at our church, but also if he would allow me to use the word "C. A. R. E." as an acrostic that stood for "Christians Actively Reaching Everyone"? He said "Great! Can we

“And he gave some...pastors and teachers; For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry...” - Ephesians 4:11-12

When the King James translation was read in the 17th Century, the word “perfecting” (c. 1398) would have been understood to mean “bringing to full development.” The word “equip” (c. 1523) would have been recognized as a mariner term meaning “to fit out a ship.” This meaning was refined over the years and during the 19th Century it meant “to dress; to habit. Hence to furnish with arms, or a complete suit of arms, for military service...But the word seems to include not only arms, but clothing, baggage, utensils, tents, and all apparatus of an army, particularly when applied to a body of troops.” Our current definition of the word “equip” has lost some of the earlier meaning as it has been generalized for use outside the military. The 19th Century definition is instructive within the context of the Apostle Paul’s letter to the Ephesians. As we pastors equip the saints for the ministry in the midst of a spiritual battle, the importance of the call is accentuated.

As a pastor, do you have a process to carry out that call? What if you knew what the “all things” include and how to teach your church family to do those things? That is exactly what we teach you to do through the C.A.R.E. Discipleship Process. We teach you to teach others to be Christians Actively Reaching Everyone. We also show you how to bring those “concepts” to

use the acrostic too?” — and thus C. A. R. E. was born.

Over the past eight years I have repeatedly tried to write discipleship material that would assist those I pastor in becoming Christians Actively Reaching Everyone. During that time period God brought the co-author of the C.A.R.E. Discipleship Courses into my life and God has used him greatly to advance the ministry.

I want to challenge all of you pastors reading this to take a brief test. If “John Doe” visits your church family, do you have a structured/defined process to disciple him to maturity in Christ? Can you teach him to “observe all things” Christ commanded? Can you teach him to be a Christian Actively Reaching Everyone? How many in your church family or better still on your church roll are Christians Actively Reaching Everyone? Do you have a process to carry out the call God has placed on your life, as defined in Ephesians 4:12? I didn’t either, but there’s hope.
